

**AWARDING CME CREDIT TO REVIEWERS —  
INSTRUCTIONS FOR REVIEWERS**

BMJ now grants reviewers with Continuing Medical Education (CME) credits from the Cleveland Clinic in exchange for their work. We have found that rewarding reviewers in this manner has proven invaluable to reviewers by enabling them to gain further recognition for their work while encouraging them to continue contributing their time and energy to enhancing the medical literature.

The CME process at BMJ is handled within ScholarOne by the editor responsible for managing peer review for the paper. When you submit your review to the *Journal for ImmunoTherapy of Cancer*, you will be asked if you would like to receive CME credit in exchange for your work. If you select yes, upon completion of the review, the handling editor will be asked to evaluate the reviewer's performance on the basis of quality and timeliness. Any reviewer who receives a perfect score in both categories is eligible to receive CME credit.

If the editor awards you credit, you will receive an e-mail containing a link to the Cleveland Clinic's website, where you will be asked to complete a brief survey before claiming your credit. (Please note that, if it is the first time you are receiving credit from the Cleveland Clinic, you will need to create an account.)

All reviewers for *JITC* can be considered for CME credit. There is no limit to the number of reviews for which a reviewer can receive credit, but a reviewer will receive only one credit per paper.
